Quality support from Sports Apprentice – supporting staff with teaching PE, organising equipment and resources, supporting Foundation Stage Physical Development sessions.	<p>Children have access to high quality PE sessions, which has a year-on-year impact evidenced through children's engagement and developing skills. Teachers work alongside the Sports Apprentice developing their own expertise and confidence in delivering a range of sports, ensuring longer-term sustainability.</p> <p>A wide variety of extra-curricular sports clubs are offered across the school every night of the week.</p> <p>Attendance at sports clubs have increased this year: 2015-2016: 115 children - 50% 2016-2017: 143 children - 63% These figures represent the number of children that have attended at least one sports club over the year.</p>	£8,558
Cyber-coach	<p>All staff use the Cyber-Coach software and have found it useful in supporting with creative teaching ideas for PE.</p> <p>The software allows access to quality physical activity during adverse weather conditions or when the hall is unavailable due to unavoidable timetable changes. It also means children can access short sessions of physical activity to increase their fitness levels as well as being used as a "brain-break" during the day.</p>	£342
RAiD collaboration events	<p>Events were organised with schools within the collaboration – 3 year groups attended football (held at the Sports Centre), cricket (held at Priory Fields) and Speed stacking (held at St Martin's).</p> <p>These events enable pupils to mix with other schools and develop links. The events also support Year 6 transition to secondary school.</p>	£100
