WHAT IS THE LEADING PARENT PARTNERSHIP AWARD? (LPPA)

We are using the Leading Parent Partnership Award (LPPA) to help strengthen our school's partnership with parents. LPPA is a national award that will provide us with a valuable school improvement tool and also give us recognition for our commitment to working with parents. The award will be helping the schools in the Whinless Down Academy Trust to work in partnership with all parents and carers. Increasing parental participation in school life leads to improved pupil progress, punctuality, attendance and behaviour. The framework encourages parents to be involved in their children's learning leading to improved outcomes in all aspects of school life. The programme is delivered by trained LPPA advisers and high standards are maintained through a consistent quality assurance process. To achieve the award schools have to work towards meeting nine different objectives, building up evidence to support them before they can achieve the award.

5. The school provides a good induction for all new parents.
6. The school provides parents with relevant and user-friendly guidance and information to help them support their children's learning.
7. The school produces and implements parent friendly policies to establish effective home-school links and improve children's attendance, punctuality, progress and positive participation in school.
8. The school provides good support for all parents as their children move through or leave the school.
