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Reminders

An influencer is somebody prominent on a social media platform, who has a high number of followers. They share their opinions/ideas and may be paid to advertise/promote products through their account. These opinions can be expressed or interpreted as fact. It is important to talk to your child about the spread of misinformation online and how we should fact check and critically analyse what we see and hear online.
