# Maths 123

This term in Maths, we will be working on adding and subtracting numbers mentally to at least 10,000. Along with adding and subtracting numbers with more than four digits.

Also, we will be using our knowledge of addition and subtraction to solve multistep word problems.

In Topic Maths, we will be looking at converting between units of length. Also, we will be measuring and calculating the perimeter of shapes.



This term in English, we are reading, 'The Princess'
Blankets' by Carol Ann Duffy, and our writing will
mainly be linked to this book. The children will
showcase their writing skills, including writing formal
letters and explanation texts. We will also be
summarising the main ideas from parts of 'The Princess'
Blankets'.

### **Riveting Rivers**

Children will examine how a river changes from its source to the mouth. We will examine the Water Cycle and children will be able to draw a diagram of this. We will use Atlases to find rivers in the UK and from around the World. Children will find out about the features of rivers, including waterfalls, meanders and Oxbow lakes. Children will be expected to discuss how materials can be separated and the types of changes which are irreversible.

In Art/DT...

The children will experiment with water colours. This will then link to our creative curriculum topic, where we will be inspired by local rivers.



In RE...

We will explore the question: Who is a Sikh and what do they believe?

We will investigate and explain the main beliefs of Sikhism.



In Music...We'll learn to compose melodies made from pairs of phrases in either C major or A minor. These melodies will be enhanced by rhythmic or chordal accompaniments. Also, children will be working in pairs to create a piece of music to a silent film or a scene from a film.

In Computing...

We will continue to reinforce ideas about staying safe online. We will look at how we can report things if we feel unsafe. As well as this, we will be considering copyright and plagiarism.



In PSHE...

Year 5 will be considering the decisions people make with money. We will be looking at what influences how people spend and save money. We will also be considering what makes something 'value for money'.
