

Week 2 - he, she, me, we, be, was, you, they, all, are, my, her. Week 3 - off, puff, fluff, huff, cliff, sniff, staff, cuff. Week 4 - bell, yell, tell, doll, bull, well, will. <p><u>Persuasive poster:</u></p> <p>Think of something you would really like to do or a place you might want to go to. For example; Kidz Planet. Create a persuasive poster to give to your parents, family or even me!</p> <p>Persuade us!</p>	<p><u>Character descriptions:</u></p> <p>Our key text this term is 'The Three Little Pigs' Read the story at home with an adult. Now choose either one of the three little pigs or the Big Bad Wolf and describe them using adjectives.</p> <p>Draw a picture of the character you have chosen and then label it,</p> <p>Challenge: Put the adjectives into a sentence. Can you extend your sentence using 'and' or 'because'?</p>	<p><u>Doubling:</u></p> <p>Choose a number. Count out the correct amount of objects for that number. Now work out what double that number is.</p> <p>Doubling challenges:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Choose a number up to 5 and double it. Tell an adult what it is. 2. Choose a number up to 10 and double it, Can you write that number down? 3. Choose a number up to 15 and double it. Can you write the sentence for your doubled number? Eg. $8+8=16$. I would love to know some!</p>	<p><u>Materials and properties</u></p> <p>Make a den at home using a selection of different materials. Can you think which materials might help it last and be stronger than other materials?</p> <p>Take a picture and label it with the materials.</p> <p>Challenge: Put the reason for choosing that material into a sentence. For example, I used wood for the outside cause it is hard.</p>	<p><u>Happy Hippo</u></p> <p>Create a jar full of pieces of paper to say things that have made you happy or things you have enjoyed. It can be anything.</p> <p>Look back through your jar if you are ever feeling a little bit sad, worried or need a Happy Hippo boost!</p>
