

Early Years Home Learning TERM 4 – Who are you going to call?

This term we are learning all about real life superheroes, such as Police Officers and Firefighters. Can you make your own prop and pretend to help people? You could make a police helmet, nurse badge or a doctor's bag!	This term we are celebrating World Book Day! Can you make your own mini picture book of your favourite story? You could draw a picture on each page and get an adult to help you write the story, or try to write the key words yourself.	Repeating patterns are the same pattern over and over again. Can you use something that you have at home to make your own repeating pattern? You could use Lego, pencils, toys, or flowers or draw it in your book. Can you challenge yourself to make a pattern with 3 or 4 colours?
At the end of this term, we will be celebrating Easter! Can you make an Easter card for somebody that you love? Decorate the front with an Easter picture and then write a message inside. Don't forget to use tricky word 'to' and sign your name inside!	Can you practice writing your tricky words superhero style? See if you can write them in a superhero spiky shape or inside a superhero badge or logo.	Collect some natural objects on a walk or from your garden. You could collect leaves, petals, twigs or shells. Use the loose parts to make some numbers 0-10.
Superheroes have special powers. These include being super strong, fast and clever. Eating healthy food helps you to be these things. Can you make a healthy snack to enjoy at home? It could be a smoothie, a fruit kebab or a salad! Take a photo or draw a picture of your snack in your book for us to see!	We will be reading Supertato at school this term! Supertato is a potato who saves the day! Can you design your own superhero with special superhero powers? Can you draw it and then label their powers and features?	We have been learning how to subitise. This is where we recognise an amount without counting. We use dice to help us with this. Can you play a game at home with dice such as snakes and ladders? See if you can recognise the number you roll without counting the dots. Maybe you could draw the dice patterns in your book!



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
